

# Standard Operating Environment (SOE)

Windows 10 is the standard operating environment deployed by the university on all campus machines. The default line of business applications installed on campus machines are

- Microsoft Office Professional Plus 2013
- Google Chrome, Internet Explorer, Microsoft Edge and Mozilla Firefox
- IBM SPSS Statistics
- Endnote X8
- Adobe Acrobat Reader DC
- VLC Media Player

The Information Technology Office (IT) handle all updates, application testing and installation, hardware setups and upgrades on all university-owned devices.

## Log On

To log onto a student computer on campus complete these steps.

- 1. Press the keys ALT+CTRL+DEL
- 2. Agree to the Acceptable Use Policy

### Start Menu

All approved applications are accessible under the Start Menu. The Start Menu is split into two sections:

**Left Side:** All installed applications approved for student use.

- Listed under their company name in alphabetical order

Right Side: Quick Access links

- Web Browsers: Internet Explorer, Google Chrome, Mozilla Firefox
- Microsoft Office 2013: Word, Excel, PowerPoint

These groups cannot be removed or added to as the administrator locks them.





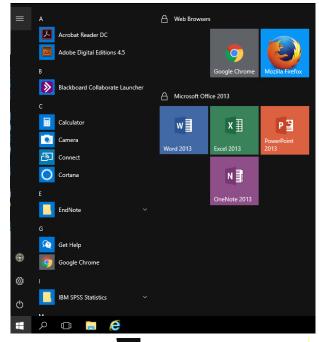
The Start Menu is located in the bottom left of the desktop.

# For example:

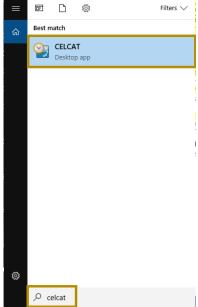
Office applications (word, excel) are listed under Microsoft Office.
